

## Pupil Equity Fund Spending Results of Parental Consultation (120 Responses)



Pupil Equity Funding is additional funding from the Scottish Government allocated directly to schools and targeted at closing the poverty related attainment gap. In Millersneuk Primary, we have received £12 960 for next session. This money is targeted at specific pupils but in doing so the PEF spending proposal can also improve attainment and achievement for all pupils. This year we propose to use the money to continue to employ another Classroom Assistant. This support staff member would:

- Work throughout the school to support the health & wellbeing of identified children which is essential to allow children to reach their full learning potential
- Work with Class Teachers to support any individuals/small groups in Literacy and Numeracy & Mathematics
- Provide support to pupils during social times e.g. break & lunch
